Coosa High School is one of four high schools within the Floyd County school system which is located approximately 70 miles northwest of Atlanta, Georgia. Within the system there are also four middle schools and eight elementary schools. Floyd County was one of the first systems in the state of Georgia to gain charter status. The operational model includes four high schools as well as the Floyd County College and Career Academy, a facility available for all system juniors and seniors who wish to complete a CTAE pathway. In March 2011, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) completed an extensive review of Floyd County Schools and recommended the system to receive District Accreditation.
